It reminded me, at least partially, of incidents that often played out after dinner in our home when we kids were young. We all had assigned chores and the two middle sisters (Teri and Sue) were tasked with doing the dishes. But often when it was time to wash the dishes, Teri would develop the need to go to the bathroom, leaving Sue to do the chore. This may be easy to answer, but which of the two girls was obeying her parents?

The Parable of the Two Sons can be found in Matthew 21:28-32. The basic story is of a man with two sons who told them to go work in the vineyard. The first son refused, but later obeyed and went. The second son initially expressed obedience, but actually disobeyed and refused to work in the vineyard. The son who ultimately did the will of his father was the first son because he eventually obeyed. Jesus then likens the first son to tax collectors and prostitutes—the outcasts of Jewish society—because they believed John the Baptist and accepted "the way of righteousness" (v. 32), in spite of their initial disobedience to the Law. And the son who didn't obey the father? He was likened to the Pharisees, who were so righteous that they did not realize that each and every individual (no matter who) must be aware of his or her own sinfulness and their need for repentance and forgiveness to be in a right relationship with God.
