Did you know that Diane's sister-in-law Kris Hayek is a missionary in Africa? I mention this because I am suggesting that we contribute to her mission as our church's Christmas project this year. Last year, we raised money for Operation Smile. I asked Diane to contact Kris in order to find out how we could help her and here follows her response:

"Actually, if you want to collect money, audiBibles are the best thing. We buy 3,000 a year, but try to buy more if we can. We give every new group one because people can't read. We get the Bible read in most primary local languages. We get them from South Africa for \$30 each. The village Christians think this is the best thing to happen for them! They ask for more and more as new groups are started."

If you would like to contribute to this year's Christmas project, make out your check to St. Mary's Anglican Mission and write "Africa". For each \$30 that we are able to give, Kris will be able to buy one audiBible and we'll be able to do our part in fulfilling the Great Commission.
